Jack Carroll, Provincial Minister of Welfare, will represent Premier Duff Roblin in the official ribbon cutting ceremony on Saturday. This will be followed by an open house where tea will be served by the Ladies' Auxiliary of the Kiwanis Club, and to which everyone is welcome.

These new homes were built at a cost of \$120,000 and consists of 12 single suites and six doubles. In addition there is a furnished lounge and laundry room equipped with automatic washer and dryer.
