

B-A Plans Station On Watt St.

Construction of a second service station at the corner of Watt and Neil will be started shortly although members of East Kildonan Council aren't happy with the situation.

The British American Oil Co. Ltd., purchasers of the property from the British American Land Development Co., were represented at the meeting by D. J. Jessiman, of Johnston, Jessiman, Gardner & Swancar.

Mr. Jessiman reminded Council that he had appeared before them one month ago and had delayed action on the site as Council was not in favor of another service station at that corner.

He said that the British American Oil Co., Ltd. had looked at other properties in the municipality but could not find one as suitable as the one they had purchased. They had considered a site on Grey st. but a car count there did not measure up to their expectations.

Mr. Jessiman stated he was sorry if residents in the area disapproved of another service station but he assured Council it would be built to plans which he submitted to the mayor.

Councillors Armstrong and Reid, representatives of the area, wanted their protests recorded.

Two service stations on one corner, and another about six blocks north, was just a little too much, they felt, even if they were in a commercial area.
