0 න C Contract Let For Erection of Fine Edifice of Worship-Short

History of Parish.

The erection of a new Anglican church in Elmwood has commenced, the contract having been let to the Jackson Building company. Architect Sherwood made the plan, and has charge of the work, which is to be completed by Oct. 15. The contract price of the building is \$4,500.

e.: The Rev. R. C. Johnstone was the first incumbent of Elmwood, having commenced his work about five years th. first incumbent of Elmwood, having commenced his work about five years ago. During his time a small mission church was erected on Yairn avenue, the site being a gift to the parish from St. John's cathedral. About a year ago the need was felt for a resident clergy-man, who could devote his whole time to the church work in this now rapidly growing district. Accordingly the Rev. E. C. R. Pritchard, former rec-tor-of Birlle, was called to take charge of the work. Mr. Pritchard commenced his duties last January, and it was not long before the congregation of St. Cuthbert's realized that the little Mis-sion church would not accommodate the worshippers. Steps were then taken to dispose of the little church and both church and site were sold last spring for \$3,000 cash. A new site was pro-cured in a more central position at a cost of \$1,700, leaving the congregation a neat balance of \$1,300 net as a nucleus for a new church. The new site is on the corner of McIntosh and Brazier. The building now in the course of erection is to be known as St. Cuth-bert's church institute, and will be run on institutional lines. The idea is to use this building not only for divine service but for general parochial gath-erings, and at some later time, when the congregation has grown sufficiently or 16 st :d 1-'n ì= **`S**. congregation has grown sufficiently strong, a permanent church will be built on the two adjoining lots, and the present building kept for a Sunday school and general parish room.
