

Unemployed Youth Centre To Open First of Week At Anna Gibson School

**Local Centre Will Open Monday
at 1.30 p.m.—Plans for Equip-
ping Same In Progress—Com-
mittee Appointed to Take
Charge, Under Supervision**

General satisfaction will be expressed throughout the community over the announcement that a centre for the unemployed youth of Elmwood will be opened in the Anna Gibson school Monday afternoon at 1.30. This information reached "The Herald" office as our final forms went to press late Wednesday afternoon. Our informant was Dr. J. C. Pincock, superintendent of the Winnipeg schools, and the information was conveyed by telephone. Dr. Pincock appeared particularly pleased to make the announcement.

A committee of young people has been set up, with Cecil Stewart as chairman and Ethel Coleman as secretary-treasurer, and will function under senior supervision.

It is the hope of the committee to have a sewing room fitted up for girls, for the opening, with a manual training room for boys, equipped with benches for carpentry work. The committee is also hopeful having a reading room adequately equipped and furnished for the opening.

Unemployed young people who have not been in close touch, and who are not informed on the detail of the plan and the conduct of the centre are urged to be in attendance Monday afternoon, and avail themselves of the opportunity which will then be afforded of viewing the scope of the work and conditions governing registration at the centre.

Unemployed Youth Centre At Anna Gibson School

**Decision Reached at Largely-
Attended Meeting Monday
Night—Dr. Pincock and School
Trustees Support Proposal—
Opening Meeting at Anna Gibson
School This (Friday) Afternoon**

Between 200 and 300 young people of the community gathered in the auditorium of the Lord Selkirk school Monday evening in response to an invitation from the superintendent of the Winnipeg schools, Dr. J. C. Pincock. The meeting was called at the request of Mr. E. McGrath, for many years a resident of Elmwood, and school trustee for ward three.

The object of the meeting was to discuss with the young unemployed of Elmwood the feasibility of opening the Anna Gibson school, now vacant, as a community centre for social activities, recreation and study.

Mrs. Jessie McLennan, chairman of the school board, occupied the chair, and short addresses were made by Dr. Pincock, Messrs. McGrath, A. Vilecki, W. Ross and W. Scraba, expressing the desire of the Board to assist the unemployed young people of the district by opening this centre and outlining suggested plans for the undertaking.

Representatives of the recently-organized community club were also present and expressed sympathy with the proposal and their willingness to co-operate in every way possible.

Meeting This Afternoon

The centre will be opened for further discussion and plan-making at the Anna Gibson school this (Friday) afternoon at 3 o'clock. All the young people who were present Monday night, with any other unemployed young people of the district, are urged to be present at this opening meeting and to take part in making further plans.
