

\$462,000 School Bylaw In North Kildonan

North Kildonan ratepayers will be asked to vote on a \$462,000 money bylaw in a few weeks which will provide for a 14-classroom school and auditorium on the Lord Kitchener School site and a 4-classroom addition to Princess Margaret School.

Direct cost to the taxpayer will be \$184,800 as 60% of the total cost will be assumed by the provincial government.

Present overcrowding in North Kildonan schools will become worse if the bylaw is not passed, a school trustee told the Herald Wednesday.

Staggering of some classes at Springfield Heights, Princess Margaret and Lord Kitchener schools will also be necessary.

The bylaw, if passed, will provide for modern facilities at the Lord Kitchener site, keep North Kildonan School District in line with trends and demands of an up-to-date educational system, and provide special rooms for libraries, music and visual education.
