

East Kildonan Community Club Gets New Baseball Diamond Site

At a well-attended meeting of the baseball committee of the East Kildonan Community Club K. A. Davidson, committee chairman, announced that the East Kildonan Municipal Council has passed a resolution setting aside an area of land located on the corner of Melrose and Roch as a new hardball diamond for the East Kildonan Community Club.

This new playground area will extend east on Melrose about 500 feet and north on Roch a similar distance. Arrangements will be made to have the Parks Board clear this land and level it as soon as weather permits.

This new diamond will be used by the club's two entries in the City Baseball League, which are the Midgets and the Bantams. Backstops and spectator stands will be erected in time for the season's opening.

The following team managers and coaches were appointed: Midgets, manager, Russ McCreedy; coach, George Fright; Bantams, manager, Jack Cuthbertson; coaches, Len. Prevet and Ed. Gervais; Little League, manager, K. A. Davidson; coach, Mike Mitchell; Pony League,

manager, John Dykes; coach, Jack Price.

It was decided to form a separate section for the softball, and Jack Willis was appointed chairman of this section. Mr. Willis stated that the following girls' teams will be operated this season: Junior, midget, bantam and married ladies.
