

## Model Dairy

A representative from the Advance had the pleasure of inspecting Mr. G. Kammrath's dairy in East Kildonan on Tuesday of this week. He was first conducted through the large stable which is 30x70 feet and has a stabling capacity of 36 cows, with a large storeroom for feed over head. The barn was built during the past summer and has all the modern conveniences. The floors are made of cement with a plank floor laid in cement underneath the cattle. Each cow is allowed  $3\frac{1}{2}$  feet of space. A cement trough the full length of the building full of water is within easy reach of each cow and the manger is so arranged that the cattle cannot trample their food. The broad floor between the two rows of cattle is washed off every day by means of a water hose and the gutters are also flushed daily. The stables are well ventilated with 10 Kings ventilaters. At a convenient spot is a large tank in which chop and shorts are mixed ; also a wash basin. The water is secured from a 40 barrel tank in the top of the building and is forced there from an artesian well by means of a Myers pump, operated by a 5 horse power motor. The stable cost \$2100. Coming to the milk house which is at a distance from the stable he was shown the various devises for cooling, cleansing and purifying the milk and sterilizing the cans. The milk
