

NEW HOSPITAL IS OPENED IN ELMWOOD

Winnipeg Sanatorium Building
Acquired by Mennonite Hos-
pital Society — Four-Storey
Brick and Stone Structure Now
Completely Equipped

"The Mennonite hospital society" has opened a new hospital in Elmwood, on the right bank of the Red river, just above Louise Bridge. It is to be known as "Concordia Hospital."

The building, a four-storey brick and stone structure, was formerly the Winnipeg Sanatorium, but has been out of use for several years. The Mennonites have completely decorated the building, and had new plumbing installed.

Though the move from their old location on Beverly st. was made within the past two weeks, already the hospital has 20 patients and is completely equipped for medical, surgical and obstetrical work. There are 50 beds and one of the features of it will some day be the natural salt spring, which, however, the hospital has not yet been able to put into shape.

A grand official opening of the hospital is being planned sometime in June, when the Mennonite farmers in Manitoba will be able to get away from the farms and come into the city for this occasion.
