

Legion Asks East Kildonan To Develop Golf Course

At the first regular meeting of the council of the municipality of East Kildonan in August, Reeve W. P. Larsen presided, with Councillors F. W. Dryden, T. Armstrong and C. H. Vickers also present.

A five-man delegation representing the Canadian Legion Golf club enquired from the meeting if the council would consider entering into negotiations with the Canadian Legion Golf club for the development of the property east of Henderson Highway from the street railway wye to the C.P.R. track for a golf course.

The plans for the proposed development have not been fully outlined by the committee of the Canadian Legion, but it was their opinion that the property should be leased by the municipality in order that the municipality may retain competent control to ensure that residents of East Kildonan will be permitted to play on the course. The Legion would like the golf course reserved for Legion members at week-ends.

A member of the delegation then outlined the history of the Legion Golf club since its organization in 1924 and consent was asked to investigate the land and survey the possibilities of development.

Council agreed that permission be granted to the Canadian Legion Golf club to investigate the possibilities of developing the proposed golf course, the committee to report its finding to council in due course.

Complaints regarding the use of saws in garages on private property for commercial purposes were referred to the engineer and chief of police to report back to council.

On the motion of Councillors Armstrong and Dryden the date of the tax sale for the municipality for the year 1947 was set as October 10th.

Friday, the 31st of October, was set as the date on which council will sit as a Court of Revision.

Deputy Reeve Geo. Suttie was authorized to sign all cheques and other documents of the municipality in the absence on vacation of Reeve W. P. Larsen.

On the motion of Councillors Dryden and Vickers, council decided that a letter be sent to C. H. Dahl, Winnipeg Electric Company, advising him that the council wish to confer with representatives of the Winnipeg Electric Company at the municipal hall in regard to services on the East Kildonan and Morse Place lines, in connection with Mr. Dahl's letter of 17th July.

The reeve and secretary-treasurer were authorized to sign an agreement between the Minister of Health and Public Welfare and the municipality for a Public Health nurse.

A report from the engineer ad-

peg stopped dumping at the East Elmwood nuisance ground there have been a number of trucks hauling rubbish to East Kildonan nuisance grounds, and suggesting that a man be placed at the dump to control the situation.

Council agreed that the engineer be authorized to employ a man to watch the nuisance grounds and stop illegitimate dumping.

In the matter of watermain construction referred from the council meeting of July 21, it was decided the secretary - treasurer request authority from the Municipal and Public Utility Board for an over-expenditure of \$1,500.

A number of by-laws were before the meeting for the due consideration of council, and other business of a routine nature disposed of.

Ison will officiate. The pallbearers will be Henry Stewart, Andrew Smith, Arthur Baker and Joseph Lama.

The tragedy occurred at the airport dock on the Saskatchewan river. The wee fellow was three years old on Aug. 1 and the family had just moved to Prince Albert 10 days before the accident happened. The body was recovered Monday afternoon by the R.C.M.P. Besides his parents, Albert is survived by his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. A. Deane, 228 Munroe ave.

NEW AIR LETTER FORM DESIGNED

A postage-imprinted Canada Air Letter Form will take the place of the one now in use, it was announced recently by the Hon. Ernest Bertrand, K.C., M.P., Postmaster General.

Effective on September 1st, the new forms may be purchased at Post Offices in the same way as ordinary stamps. They will be sold in the 10 cent (blue) and 15 cent (red) denominations—the former variety being for destinations in the United Kingdom and Elre, and the latter for places beyond the British Isles where Canada Air Letter Service is given.
