The percentage of each of these three events which go to make up the cycle of life in every community are laid out in careful detail.

A large part of the book is taken up by a minute survey of the mortality statistics, carefully dividing all causes of death, and reporting on them with regard to sex, age and month of death. The second portion of the book is taken up with a manual of the international list of the causes of death, based on the second decennial revision by the international commission.
