

# Delegation Seeks More Land For New Community Club

J. Clark, 374 Leighton ave., was spokesman for a delegation which Monday night presented the East Kildonan Council with a 250 signature petition for more land at the Roc-Lin Community Club site.

The club now has a tot lot on the north-east corner of Roch and Linden. The petition asks for 500 feet north and east of the present land towards Greene ave.

**The 250 signatures were from residents in the area from Brazier to Roch and Dunrobin to Leighton.**

Mr. Clark said it was desirable to extend the present site because Bronx Park was too far away for children. They also had to cross the busy highway to get there. Additional signatures are expected.

Council agreed to refer the petition to the Parks Board as parks and recreational facilities fall under the jurisdiction of that body.

**The secretary of the club had a letter before Council stating there was speeding in the vicinity of Roch and Linden and asked for playground signs.**

The letter went on to say that if the municipality couldn't afford to put up the signs, the community club would foot the bill.

Council approved the erection of playground signs on Roch and stop

signs on Linden. Council has been gradually installing stop signs on avenues crossing Roch for some time.

## Montrose Ave. Man Grows Big Spuds
