The plant is the first of its ne type in Manitoba, and its pro-th ducts will replace goods that ex were formerly unported here an from other provinces or coun-tries. Besides catering to the Manitoba market, Price-Acme will set up a sales organization to distribute goods across the re country.

The mill and manufacturing project has been organized through the combined efforts of two existing companies, E. H. not have and lames Richard-Price Ltd. and James Richardson and Sons Ltd. The plant will he be completely Canadian-financed and it will prove the complete the comple and it will occupy land adjacent to the existing E. H. Price building.

First stage plans call for a fac-

tory and aluminum mill with a floor space of 13,200 square feet. The factory and mill will become integrated with E. H. Price's present facilities, making a total floor area of 20,400 square feet. Production of extruded aluminum is scheduled to start in November and there will be 35 employees at the outset. Technical operations at the new

plant will be supervised by another existing firm, Acme Manufacturing Co. Raw aluminum r billets for manufacturing opera-tions will be supplied by the Aluminum Co. of Canada.
