

Sir James Aikins to Open Tribune Radio Concert With Speech

Large Audience to Hear Music in Fort Garry Hotel

Tonight's concert, to be broadcast by The Tribune radio station, will be opened formally by a brief address at 8:30 o'clock by His Honor, Sir James Aikins, lieutenant-governor of Manitoba, who will extend greetings to an innumerable audience of thousands.

Today The Tribune received messages that Oshkosh, Wisconsin, and Moline, Illinois, intended to "listen in." W. B. Carter, 90 Church st., Oshkosh, Wis., advised that he heard The Tribune's concert on Monday night of this week. He is 773 miles away from Winnipeg.

The Tribune's broadcast concert will be heard in the Fort Garry hotel by 600 persons, the management of the hotel having arranged a concert party by invitation. A splendid auxiliary program also has been arranged in case of atmospheric or other difficulties. Tests of the wireless installation at the Fort Garry were made Wednesday night by L. S. Payne, Marconi engineer in charge of The Tribune installation, and proved very satisfactory.

There will be more than 200 artists alone participating in The Tribune concert, so that it has become necessary to exclude visitors from the sixth floor of The Tribune building during the concert.

Tribune Premises Closed to Public During Concert

THE Tribune has received many requests for admission to its premises during tonight's radio broadcast concert. It has been compelled, regretfully, to decline in every case.

There will be more than 200 artists alone performing. This number will tax the capacity of The Tribune's radio concert room to the utmost. Aside from His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor, the Oratorio Society, the Male Voice Choir, the Princess Patricia's Band and the soloists, none but essential staff can be accommodated.

The Tribune therefore finds it necessary to announce that during the concert its premises will not be open to the general public, and respectfully asks the co-operation of its readers to ensure the success of the concert. If amateur wireless fans will refrain from transmitting from 8.30 to 10.30 o'clock, the engineers will be materially assisted.
