The new No. 24 Station is a three-bay Fire Station with accomodations for three Fire Companies and a total of 15 men. At present it houses one

Pumper Company and one

No. 8 Station on Kimberly

Water Tanker with five men. but consideration has been given in its design to future development in the area and the possible need for expanded fire protection in the area it serves. It is functional in design yet presents an attractive external appearance with well landscaped grounds of sufficient area that it does not encoach too closely to the residential properties which will surround it. The new Station includes facilities as well for routine training and drill exercises.
