

River East Board Chairman Dies Following Brief Illness

Prominent Public Educational Official, Mr. B. E. Glavin of the East Kildonan, Manitoba, Chairman of the River East School Division #9, passed away after a brief illness on August 10, at the Grace Hospital.

Mr. Glavin served continually on the River East Board since its formation in 1959, as chairman, with the exception of three terms and was the only remaining trustee from the first Board.

He was a public dedicated official, as member of the Manitoba Association of School Trustees Executive from 1966-1970, president in 1969 and on the executive of the Western Canada School Trustees Conference for the years of 1968-1969.

He was recognized by the Manitoba Government and appointed a member of the Local Government Boundaries Commission of 1968-1970.

In the community of East Kildonan, he was a member of the East Kildonan Scholarship Foundation, now the

River East Scholarship Foundation since 1960, and a senior member of the St. Stephen's Anglican Church, East Kildonan, serving as a Vestry Man Rector's Warden and in all the capacities.

As a public servant he was manager and consultant with the Manitoba Hydro Credit Union since 1961, a member of the Board of the Credit Union Society of Manitoba from 1963-1969 and also of the Credit Union Financial

Services for the same period.

He is survived by his wife, Viola, 176 Greene ave., two sons, Gary of Winnipeg and Dennis of Toronto, grandson Michael, one sister, Mrs. E. V. Wilson of Tottenham, Ontario, one niece, Mrs. G. B. Mallion of Tottenham, Ontario, one nephew, V. E. Wilson of Hamilton, Ontario.

The funeral service was conducted Monday afternoon from St. Stephen's Anglican Church.
