

# New A & P Supermarket Open To Public Today

Located in the northern extremity of East Kildonan, between Lord Wolseley School and the Eldorado Drive-In, the new A & P super market was opened to the public Thursday morning before a large crowd of early shoppers.

Mayor Geo. Suttie, who was accompanied by members of East Kildonan Council and other interested officials, cut the ribbon which was the signal for the official opening.

The mayor, in addressing the gathering, said:

The ultra-modern food store, which has 12,000 square feet of floor space, is the fourth to be opened in Greater Winnipeg. Besides carrying full lines of all types of foodstuffs, the super-market will feature various non-food items at low prices. More than 4,000 different items will be stocked regularly.

Features include parcel pick-up stations, wide shopping aisles, extra check-outs and fluorescent lighting. These have been designed for the convenience of customers at both outlets.

Pastel shaded walls, rows of gleaming white cases and colorful flooring combine for decidedly attractive interiors.

Ample parking space has been reserved for cars.

The store will close at 6 o'clock tonight. Friday shopping hours are 9 a.m. to 9 p.m., and Saturdays 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.
