

PRESENT SCHEDULE OF CIVIC SALARIES

On the Whole Will Mean an Increase—Federation Submits New Rates.

The new schedule of salaries for civic employees, as approved by the Civic Employees' federation, was submitted to the board of control yesterday. On the whole the new schedule will represent an increase, although under the classification one

or two of the members of the staff might have to undergo an infinitesimal cut.

Following is the new schedule:

Clerks, cashiers, draughtsmen and computers, third class, \$95 to \$170 per month; second class, \$105 to \$120; first class, \$125 to \$150; chief clerk, \$155 to \$185.

Accountants—Assistant accountant, \$105 to \$120; accountant, \$125 to \$150; chief accountant, \$155 to \$185.

Stenographers—Third class, \$42.50 to \$50; second class, \$55 to \$70; first class, \$75 to \$100.

Assessors—Assistant assessor, \$155 to \$185.

Superintendents—Assistant superintendent market department, \$110 to \$140; division superintendent of streets, \$155 to \$185; superintendent electrical department, \$155 to \$185; superintendent light and power, \$155 to \$185.

Inspectors—Health department, \$100 to \$140; food and dairy, \$100 to \$150; market, plumbing; and sewer, \$100 to \$125; license, engineering, building, and electrical, \$100 to \$150; electrical chief inspector, \$125 to \$200.

Foremen, \$100 to \$120; granolithic walk foremen, \$4.75 per day of nine hours; asphalt repair foremen, \$5 per day of nine hours; construction foremen, \$4.50 to \$5 per day.

Fire Service waterworks—Engine attendants, pump attendants, producer and boiler firemen, \$100 per month (seven days per week); engineers, \$135 per month (seven days per week); cleaners, 35 cents per hour.

Waterworks operating—Pumping firemen, \$90 to \$100; pump operators, \$110 to \$120; No. 1 engineers, 55 cents per hour or a maximum of \$1,600 per year; cleaners, 35 cents per hour; collectors and solicitors, \$90 to \$110.

Balliff—Tax office, \$95 to \$110.

Weighmaster, \$90 to \$100; water meter reader, \$85 to \$100; special constable, \$85 to \$110; bath attendant, \$85 to \$110; inside watchmen, \$3.50 per shift of 10 hours.

Survey and engineering parties—Chairmen and rodmen, \$85 to \$100; instrument men, \$105 to \$135; chief of party, \$135 to \$165.

Sewer maintenance men, 40 cents per hour per nine hour day, six days a week; bridge operators, 35 cents, 12 hours, seven days; street cleaners, 35 cents, nine hours, six days; street maintenance, 40 cents, nine hours, six days.

The following notes are appended to the recommendations:

All salaries of employees on monthly payroll to be paid semi-monthly; annual increments to be at the rate of \$10 per month until the maximum is reached; office hours 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturdays 9 a.m. to 12 noon;

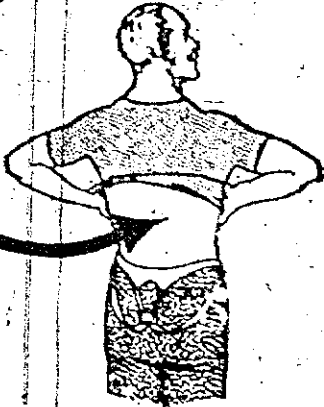
