ELMWOOD FAVORS INCORPORATION

Plebiscite Taken Saturday—405 Votes Cast—Only 22 Opposed—Mayor Sharpe Cheered.

The plebiscite taken on Saturday in Elmwood regarding the incorporation of that suburb with the city, resulted in an overwhelming vote in favor of the step being taken. Out of 405 ballots cast, 383 were marked for and 22 opposed. Five were spoiled. At 8 o'clock, the time for the closing of the poll, a large number were present to hear the result of the vote, and much satisfaction was ex-

pressed by them, on it being announced by Mr. Geo. Munroe, the returning officer. Cheers were given for Mayor Sharpe.

Much activity was apparent while the voting was in progress through the day and the parties for and against were anxious that their side should win. The poll as a result was very large and there were not many eligible voters who did not go to the polls.
