

New School Sought For North Kildonan

A committee representing owners of property in North Kildonan's Ward One is asking that a new school be built on a site within the ward's boundaries.

In a petition presented to Education Minister W. C. Miller, the committee noted that a second petition now being circulated asked that North Kildonan's Ward One be incorporated into East Kildonan.

"We petition the proper authorities that the new school to be built on the Lord Kitchener school site to serve the ward one area be built on a new site within the boundaries of ward one of North Kildonan," the committee said in its presentation. The petition was signed by 555 ward one property owners.

East Kildonan council now is considering another petition, supported by more than 80 per cent of the property owners, asking that

ward one of North Kildonan be incorporated into East Kildonan and school district No. 14 of that municipality.

The present Lord Kitchener school in ward two has eight regular classrooms and three additional auxiliary rooms to accommodate the school district's enrollment. The new Princess Elizabeth school in ward one has two classrooms, and the basement of a church provides an additional room for children in ward one.

"With the contemplated incorporation of ward one into the East Kildonan school district, it is evident that the present Lord Kitchener school is ample for the needs of the ward two area," the committee said in its petition.

Not Sufficient

In the spring of 1952, a by-law was passed authorizing the school board to build a new four-room school at a cost of \$60,000. Present plans call for the construction of this school on the Lord Kitchener site in ward two.

"If this plan is carried out, it will leave ward two area with two schools and an insufficient enrollment for these schools after the petition for incorporation of ward one into East Kildonan has been granted by the proper authorities."

G. LeBlanc, a member of the committee, said Mr. Miller had informed it that the by-law registered with the municipal and public utility board did not mention the site of the new school. Consequently its selection would be the responsibility of the trustees.
