

BRIGHT CEREMONIES AT EAST KILDONAN

May 1915

Corner Stone of Lord Kitchener School Truly Laid—Children Have Festival Day.

Standing with bared heads, in God's fresh air and sunshine, 500 pupils of the three East Kildonan schools, heard the addresses attendant on the laying of the cornerstone of the new Lord Kitchener school and saw Mrs. A. J. McDougall, wife of the secretary-treasurer of the Kildonan board of school trustees, lay the stone itself.

The ceremonies took place yesterday afternoon at 3:30, at the southeast corner of the new foundation, which stands on the East Kildonan and Ferry Roads. A great many adults were also in attendance, and a platform was built in close proximity to the stone itself, the pupils being ranged in a semi-circle about the grounds adjacent.

Had Empire Day Celebration.

The cornerstone laying marked the end of a festival day as far as the pupils were concerned. They had gathered at 10 o'clock in the grove along the river bank, to the north of the new school grounds, and held a memorable Empire day celebration, at which choruses had been sung and able addresses delivered by Revs. Harrison and Little, both of East Kildonan.

Armed with drinking cups, which hung by strings about their little necks, the children had from time to time dipped water from the natural spring in the grove, and at noon-time partaken of a luncheon spread by the teachers underneath the trees. The pupils represented the population of the three East Kildonan schools—the East Kildonan, the Rosewell and the Polsen Avenue, the total enrollment of these schools being 780.

At the extreme rear of the semi-circle formed by the children stood about 60 khaki-clad cadets, each armed with a short rifle. After the cornerstone ceremonies, they were reviewed by Col. Hosmer, who paid them several high compliments.

The chairman for the occasion was James McWee, a member of the board of trustees. He said that he was most proud of the present occasion, and predicted that the three schools, of which the Lord Kitchener was the last and farthest north, would be adequate to the needs of the municipality for some little time. He was followed by Rev. Harrison, who gave a fine description of the scenes about London on the occasion of Queen Victoria's diamond jubile, 18 years ago, and finished by saying: "If we love our king and country we shall always be loyal to our country's cause. Fear God and honor the King."

The assemblage then sang "The Maple Leaf," and the record of articles to be placed in the stone was then read by A. J. McDougall. The articles consisted of copies of the three Winnipeg newspapers, a copy of the School act, Canadian silver coins, and the following names: King George, the Duke of Connaught, Prime Minister Sir Robert Borden, Lieut.-Gov. Sir Douglas Cameron, Premier Norris, Dr. R. S. Thornton, provincial minister of education, and the members of the East Kildonan school board.

Boys and Girls Greatest Asset.

Hon. Dr. Thornton and R. Fletcher, deputy minister of education, were unable to be present at the function, and an address, which was to have been delivered by the latter, was given by C. K. Newcombe, superintendent of education. Mr. Newcombe's words were all of them worth remembering. Among other things, he said that the edifice just begun was one of the most notable events of peace. "The greatest asset which this municipality has," said he, "is not to be found in the products of its fruitful fields, but in its boys and girls."

The speaker touched on the enterprise and careful attention to school matters which the East Kildonan board of trustees had given and pleaded for the hearty support and co-operation of the pupils' parents. In

Lord Kitchener School Stages Open Session

Lord Kitchener school, North Kildonan, Thursday held an open session, concluding in the afternoon with a special programme. Guest speakers were Herbert Sulkers, M.L.A. and J. J. Hennessey, of St. Paul's college, whose subject was Drama and the School. Mr. Sulkers asked financial support of the community to raise teachers' salaries and to further the cause of education.

He also made a presentation of hockey equipment to the school on behalf of the Mothers' auxiliary of North Kildonan. A welcome to the parents was extended by Gordon Donaldson.

The high school girls presented folk dancing and medal ball work. Grade one gave a playlet entitled, The Boy and the Goat. A health parade was given by grades two and three and choral readings by grade four while grades five and six contributed a spelling match. The programme concluded with folk songs and a mixed chorus of grade seven and eight pupils.

Call of Spring

An operetta entitled "The Call of Spring," by W. H. Woolnoth and R. J. C. Chanter, will be produced by the pupils of Lord Kitchener school, North Kildonan, next Friday, under the direction of Lena E. Lovegrove, assisted by the teachers. There will be 63 children taking part in all grades from elementary to high school.

Excerpts from "The May Festival," by J. Booth, have been chosen by Mrs. L. E. Lovegrove, in the form of choruses and trios, and woven into the operetta, including the ceremony of presenting the garland, crown and sceptre to the May Queen. Also a military number by the captain and the queen's bodyguard.

The flowers are called in a duet sung by two of the maids of honor; the little flowers later dance in lively formation before paying homage to the May Queen.

The plot is set in an English village and reveals the village children having just left the green, after their May-day revels, awaiting the arrival of the May Queen. Dancing is arranged for her entertainment.

Robin, under the spell of a witch, is awakened by Spring escorted by her flowers. She remembers Love, and calls Cupid to her aid, but he only makes havoc amongst the shepherdesses.

After settling a quarrel between April and May over a garland of buttercups, the dance of Spring returns Robin to life, thereby breaking the spell. Happiness is disturbed with the entry of the Witch, who defies Spring and insists that Robin choose between them. Robin chooses Spring, and the Witch leaves amid a tumult of shrieks and curses. The dance of rejoicing follows. Spring bids farewell to the May Queen and villagers.

The operetta is interspersed with bright and catchy music. The villagers, shepherd and shepherdesses take part in several English folk dances, trained under Miss Marion Romanche. The ballet dances were supervised by Miss Eunice Lovegrove.

The programme will open with a mock auction of articles donated by the mothers' auxiliary of Lord Kitchener school, who are the sponsors. Following this will be a short play by the high school boys entitled, Tea for Three in 1978, under the direction of Miss Marion Romanche. There is to be a formation drill by the boys of the junior and senior hockey teams, for whose benefit the entertainment is put on, Mr. Hooper, principal, being responsible for the training of these boys. The operetta will occupy the second half of the programme.

Sod Turned For Kildonan High School

Construction of North Kildonan's \$55,000 Lord Kitchener junior high school, officially started Friday morning. First sod was turned by Mrs. J. R. Morton of the North Kildonan school board.

Mayor James Aitken congratulated the board for its "outstanding achievement" in adding four more classrooms to the eight they have had built within six years.

The board and North Kildonan electors were also congratulated by Hon. W. C. Miller, minister of education, Dr. R. O. MacFarlane, deputy minister, and P. C. Clark, vice-chairman of the board.

Junior High School In North Kildonan Nears Completion

North Kildonan's new Lord Kitchener Junior High School is well on its way to completion. In July work was started on the school which is by the west end of the playground at the present Lord Kitchener School on Henderson Highway. Architects are Prain and Ward. Builder and contractor is Peter Koop of East Kildonan.

In May a money by-law for \$60,000 was passed by the rate-payers of North Kildonan School District No. 2116, signalling the school board to proceed with the new school.

It is expected the building will relieve the pressure on Lord Kitchener School where it is necessary to hold classes in the auditorium. Grades 7 to 9 will be housed in the new school.

The junior high school faces east, and a road on the south side of the grounds runs east to the old building and the highway.

Exterior walls are of white stucco, with tall windows allowing a maximum of sunlight into the four classrooms.

A hallway runs the length of the building, flanked by two classrooms on either side. Teachers' rooms, washrooms, and a room for the oil heating unit at the north end below the level of the main floor make up the building. Forced air heating will be used.

The foundation rests on concrete and piles. The floor is fireproof. In appearance the school is of the same general style as the Miles Macdonell Collegiate in East Kildonan, having a flat roof and other similar features.

Interior features will be acoustically treated ceilings, slanted cork and chalk boards, and fluorescent lighting.

The school board was also engaged in expanding facilities last year when the Princess Elizabeth School, with two rooms, was opened.
