

NORTH KILDONAN SUED FOR THE SUM OF \$94,752

East Kildonan Claims Payment Re- sult of Division

The municipality of North Kildonan is the defendant in an action brought by the rural municipality of East Kildonan, in which \$94,752.57 is asked under a finding made by the municipal commissioner. The writ was issued in court of King's bench, Friday.

The statement of claim sets out

that prior to April 5, 1924 the defendant and plaintiff municipalities formed one corporation known as East Kildonan, but that by an act of the provincial legislature passed in 1924, a division took place Dec. 1, 1924. The municipal commissioner under the act was appointed to make a division of the assets of the old territory, and to ascertain the amounts to be paid by one of such new municipalities to the other, the terms of payment, and to settle all matters outstanding between the two. A hearing before the municipal commissioner took place Feb. 14, 1925, who found there was \$95,873.34 owing by the defendant to the plain-

tiff, and that same might be recovered by an action at law. Payment was at once demanded, but only \$1,120.77 has so far been received, and there is still due and outstanding \$94,752.57, the amount of the present suit.
