



Mount Kildonan or Century Mountain

These are just a couple of the names being talked about as possibilities for East Kildonan's most ambitious recreation development to date.

For the past year-and-a-half people in East Kildonan and surrounding areas have been watching the construction of what look-at one time, a pile of rubble, earth, etc. mounting on what was not too long ago -- the landfill site on Kimberly avenue.

The rough construction on this development is just about completed and it is expected that the facility will have limited use this winter.

As the hill grew in size, people were questioning what it actually was.

It has been planned mainly as a winter recreation area with facilities for skiing, sliding, tobogganing, etc., but the possibility exists that part of the hill can be used for summer recreation for outdoor band concerts, playground programs, etc.

When completed it is expected that users will have indoor comfort areas available, a tow rope, small jump sites and parking.

The peak on the right is 60 feet high and the one of the left 55 feet, while the low spot in the middle is 35 feet.

For skiing enthusiasts there will be a number of good runs but

geared mainly for recreation skiers.

The whole area will eventually be seeded and trees will be located at various strategic points all over the site.

Plans are being made at the present time by the East Kildonan Centennial Committee to use the hill for a couple of celebrations during the Christmas holidays.
