

# East Kildonan Salvage Drive

Friday is the big day in East Kildonan schools when the regular monthly drive for salvage takes place.

Under the leadership of Mrs. Alfred Warne, zone captain, the residents of East Kildonan have been digging into old trunks, attics, basements and assembling material to send to the schools on that day.

The salvage collected will be turned over to the Patriotic Salvage Corps to be sold and the profits used to help the war effort.

Mrs. Warne expects the biggest collection the East Kildonan schools have yet had for this patriotic purpose.

The East Kildonan salvage collection is really a community effort as the salvage is delivered to the headquarters at 755 Henry ave. by municipal trucks. The effort is expected to produce several tons of valuable salvage for the corps.

## East Kildonan Tops Quota As Scrap Metal Drive Opens

**T**HE Patriotic Salvage corps' drive for 2,000 tons of scrap metal started today with one district exceeding its quota.

Trucks from East Kildonan rolled into salvage headquarters with more than 10 tons of metal, and a promise that more would come. The district is under the leadership of Mrs. A. Warren.

So far this year, East Kildonan has contributed 50 tons of salvage valued at more than \$1,000.

A. E. Parker, president of the corps, was all smiles. The drive was off to a good start and he said he expected the citizens of Winnipeg would see to it that cities on the German map at Portage and Main st. would be blown to smithereens. Progress of the drive

will be shown by eliminating the German cities.

Five thousand tickets to the soccer and baseball games at the Osborne Stadium will be distributed to children entering the salvage parade Saturday morning. The tickets were contributed by Johnny Petersen, of the stadium.

The children will line up at the Cenotaph at 11.15 a.m. with their scrap metal and parade with it to Portage and Main. At 1 p.m., civic and provincial dignitaries will meet them there to welcome the youngsters. Then, as they deposit their scrap on trucks, CKY and CJRC will broadcast the ceremony.
