The church began as a small group in Winnipeg some 14 years ago, having its weekly services in a rented church. The interest and attendance grew so much that it soon became evident that they needed a building of their own.

Thereupon the church decided to purchase a small chapel on Redwood avenue.

This chapel was sufficient for only two years when more room was needed. The church then bought an old church building, seating approximately 175 at 533 Aberdeen ave,, which was partly destroyed by fire in August, 1967. The number of members then was only 40.

For the last 12 years the church has conducted its services here. Again the building became inadequate so that in July, 1967, the congregation decided to build this new church at 1011 Munroe avenue in East Kildonan.

This new church is built to seat 400 in the sanctuary, with an extra 40 in the choir-loft.
