

N. Kildonan Opens New Municipal Offices Saturday

Mayor Jack L. Pearce cut the ribbon Saturday afternoon which officially declared the opening of the slick new municipal offices in North Kildonan.

The moving of the offices from down-town to 1400 Henderson Highway is regarded as a definite forward step, and much interest in the change was evidenced by the number of citizens and residents of the neighboring municipality of East Kildonan who were present to take part in the opening ceremonies.

Mayor Pearce expressed his pleasure at seeing so many there, and although much has been accomplished in recent years, he said, still much remains to be accomplished. At the present time they were working on a program of water and sewer extension, and he felt that with the offices now in the municipality their future plans would receive closer attention and supervision.

The mayor and members of council later showed the guests through the building, all expressing pleasure and satisfaction with the beautiful furnishings and decorations. One of the features of the building is the abundance of light from windows facing north and west.

The drapes in the secretary's office were made by Mrs. Pearce.

Coffee and a light lunch were served during the afternoon, the ladies of the North Kildonan Home and School Association being in charge of the catering.
