

ASKS CITY TO TAKE IN PART EAST KILDONAN

Council of Municipality Want Preliminary Conference With Winnipeg Officials

R. N. Lowery Says Obligation Rests on City to Acquire Section Named

A conference with the Winnipeg city council will be sought immediately by the municipal council of East Kildonan, to "examine in a preliminary way the question of the city taking within its limits a portion of the municipality."

This action was taken by the council, following representations by R. N. Lowery, who thought that in view of the fact that the city of Winnipeg derived practically all the business from the district referred to—that between the city limits and Melbourne avenue—it was under an obligation to take this section into the city. He thought this would provide the only real solution to the municipal problem.

A communication was read from W. E. Hobbs, town planning commissioner, pointing out that the department would like the assurance

"to the limit" when they received their cards, so that the full amount might be guaranteed by Easter Sunday.

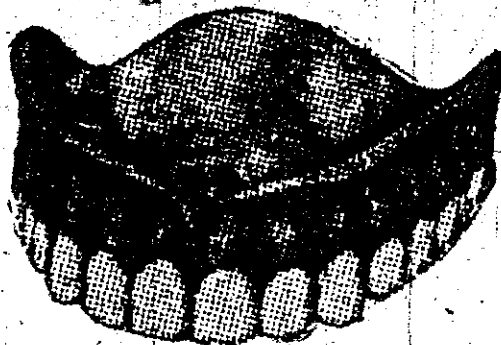
of the council, that such lands as were used for agricultural purposes, would be dealt with under provisions of the Town Planning act and be assessed as such. The council passed a motion, agreeing to give consideration to applications from any persons owning land used for agricultural purposes.

In the report of the assessor, the attention of the council was drawn to a statement made in the house by Hon. D. L. McLeod, municipal commissioner, to the effect that there were certain lands in the municipality of East Kildonan assessed at \$1,000, which should properly be assessed at about \$200 or \$300. Exception to this statement was taken by council and a motion passed that in the opinion of council an injustice had been done the municipality, and asked Mr. McLeod to make such correction to this statement, in the house, as the circumstances required.

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
