

# Beulah Baptist Congregation To Move To New Church Site

Following quickly on the heels of its 50th anniversary celebrations last week, the pastor of Beulah Baptist Church, Rev. Cyril Hunt, stated this week that the congregation would move to a new site at the corner of Watt

and Oakview this year.

It is hoped that construction on the new building will get under way in a few weeks and the congregation will be able to hold its first services before the end of 1958. The building will cost approximately \$90,000.

Adjoining the one-storey church building will be a Christian Education Building which would be used for overflow congregations. The main auditorium will seat close to 400 persons.

The present church has stood at the corner of Kelvin and Noble for 50 years but expansion of this building is not feasible. Some time ago the church obtained the new site in the name of the Baptist Union of Western Canada.

Both the Baptist Union of Western Canada, of which there are a number of families in East Kildonan attending various Baptist churches, and the Red River Valley Association of Baptist Churches, are co-operating in the project.

Already interested people are making contact with Mr. Hunt about the disposal of the Elmwood site and property.
