East Kildonan council, at a regular meeting held in the municipal offices on Monday, March 15, gave due consideration to the development and expansion of a residential area, the construction of sixty new low rental houses for veterans and asked the government to sell to veterans wartime houses at present occupied.

The first of these resolutions affects the development of Neil ave.

preparatory to the construction of some 36 dwellings together with the council's acceptance of the offer to purchase. On the motion of Councillors Dryden and Armstrong an agreement between the municipality and the contracting party was endorsed and the reeve and secretary - treasurer authorized to sign same on behalf of the municipality.

A further resolution dealt with the erection of 60 low rental houses veterans, when Councillors Vickers and Snowdon moved that council apply to the Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation for the erection of 60 Dominion Government rental houses. The properties reserved for these houses are located thus: 20 on the third block of Melbourne ave.; three on the first block of Trent ave.; nine on Oakview ave.; 20 on Dunrobin ave.,
