

## **The Hay Privilege.**

On Monday last a large meeting of the inhabitants of Kildonan was held in the Kildonan School House, (East), to consider the Hay Privilege and Rights of Common, and the Old Settlers' Claims.

W. Henderson was appointed chairman, and J. P. Matheson Secretary.

The question was very fully and intelligently discussed.

It was moved by John Frazer and seconded by John Sutherland, M. P. P. "That a committee of five be appointed to wait on His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by petition, asking the two miles extension, as the Hay Privilege commutation as referred to in the Manitoba Act."

A committee consisting of John Frazer, John Sutherland, M. P. P., John Henderson, D. Matheson and J. H. Bell, was appointed for the purpose.
