

# Tickets Now On Sale For 'Your Night' at the Concert Hall

Tickets for the Centennial project, a variety night on October 12th, at the Centennial Concert Hall, are on sale for \$1 per person.

East Kildonan '70 will once again celebrate the centennial year with a unique and exciting event, "Your Night at the Centennial Concert Hall" on Thanksgiving Day, October 12th., 1970.

The evening will begin at 6:00 p.m. with a Thanksgiving Dinner on the Piano Noble (the mezzanine floor above the main foyer). At 8:00 p.m. the great crimson curtain of the concert stage will open for a program of the best of East Kildonan talent. At 10:00 p.m. the action moves to the main foyer for dancing under the brilliant crystal chandeliers.

For the 100th anniversary of the signing of the Manitoba Act on May 15th, the East Kildonan Centennial Committee wanted to hold a celebration within the community. The result was the highly successful Confederation Ball at Rossmere Country Club. Nearly 1000 people, mostly in centennial and ethnic

dress, relived the excitement and colour of a gala ball of Manitoba's early days.

"Your Night" is being planned so that all the marvellous facilities of our beautiful concert hall, one of the finest in the world, can be enjoyed by East Kildonan citizens and their friends. Once again it is hoped that as many as possible will come in centennial or ethnic dress.

Performers include Peter Koslowsky, acclaimed Canadian tenor who has performed with symphony orchestras across Canada, accompanied by Marjorie Beckett, well-known Winnipeg pianist; Roy Joseph, the popular nightclub singer with George Goulet on guitar; the Troubadours, a group of 15 lovely girls who sing and accompany themselves with guitars and tambourines; John Cliffe of the very popular Hollow Mug 'Internationals'; and Centennial celebrations.

Arrangements are being made for many local groups and individuals to contribute their talents for an exciting and surprising program.
