

In 1912-13, Printing Compositors were paid the Union scale of ..... \$20.00 for 48 hours

In 1913 an increase of \$1.00 made the pay ..... \$21.00 for 48 hours

In 1915 an increase of 50c made the pay ..... \$21.50 for 48 hours

In 1916 an increase of 50c made the pay ..... \$22.00 for 48 hours

In 1917 an increase of \$3.00 made the pay ..... \$25.00 for 48 hours

In 1918 an increase of \$4.00 made the pay ..... \$29.00 for 48 hours

In 1919 an increase of \$6.00 made the pay ..... \$35.00 for 48 hours

In 1920 an increase of \$9.00 made the pay ..... \$44.00 for 48 hours

In 1914 a typical standard job of printing went through a Win-  
nipeg Printing House at prices then current and was charged  
out to the customer at ..... \$109.00

In April of this year, the same job, identical in every respect,  
had to be charged out at ..... \$212.00

On the basis of the time and wage scale now demanded, the  
Printing Houses would have to charge for this work ..... \$244.00

And in both the latter instances, the NET PROFIT on the work  
and overhead would be no more in dollars and cents than it was  
in 1914.
