John Hunt, showing plenty of speed and agility, won top honors in three events and was a member of the winning shuttle relay team in the East Kildonan Charter Field Day Monday.

68 ON OLD COURSE

Aging Pro Leads British Open Test

ST. ANDREWS, Scotland (CP)

An aging English golf professional a threat many times but never a star, toured St. Andrews Old Course in 68 Monday and took a commanding position in qualifying for the British Open championship.

The two - under - par round by Norman Sutton, whose wife caddied for him, was three strokes better than defending champion Peter Thomson of Australia who is aiming at his fourth straight British Open title.

Golfers in the 290 - man field play 18 more holes with the 100 top scorers going to the tournament proper, Wednesday through Friday. Players who played the Old Course Monday tackle the easier New Course today and vice versa.

While Sutton, one - time professional English soccer player, was putting together his fine round of 34-34-68, 27 - year - old Bernard Hunt of London got a 68 on the New Course and two others shot 67s. But Sutton's golf on the harder Old Course was the best.

Other leaders on the 6,936-yard, par 36-36-72 Old Course were: 70—Dai Rees, Wales, and Alfonso Angelini, Italy. 71—George Will, Jack Wilshire and Richard Burton, England; Peter Thomson, Australia; David Reed, Scotland, and Brian Wilkes, South Africa.

On the 6,526-yard, par 36-35-71 New Course, behind Hunt, were: 67 - Amateur Charles Lawrie, Scotland, and Bobby Locke, South Africa, three - time British Open champion; 69 - Sam King and Harry Weetman England, and Gary Player, South Africa, 70—Charles Ward and Syd Scott, England; Eric Lester, Scotland, and Joe Carr, Ireland.

Top American score was set by Frank Stranahan who scrambled and sank putts for a 71.

Cary Middlecoff, top-rated American entry, managed only a 75 on the New Course.
