The Community Committee asks for a swing spring lock instead of the padlock for the school crossing to Hampstead School on the C.P.R. Mainline

The Lions Club of East Kildonan asks to have the chain of office they donated for the Mayor of East Kildonan returned to their club but the Community Committee votes to retain the chain of office until such time as a suitable plaque or cabinet is built to house such mementoes of East Kildonan in the Recreational Centre (Terry Sawchuk Arena)

March 9, 1972 – Welfare Assistance cases in February 1972

March 16, 1972 – The East Kildonan Community Committee is given the authority to issue four liquor permits for community events

Mr. Gunter Schoch is appointed the Arborist and consultant on boulevard tree planting in East Kildonan

Complaints are received about sawdust blowing from the Wittler Furniture Company Plant located near the corner of Kimberly and Golspie

The East Kildonan Community Committee ask City Council to consider annexing the parts of East St Paul and Springfield located within the Perimeter Highway

It is recommended that the bus service and turnaround be moved from Henderson Highway south of Valhalla Drive to Henderson Highway and Glenway

Six summer students are to be hired to clean up debris along Bunn's Creek from the Red River to Highway 59

April 10, 1972 – The River East School Division asks for water and sewer service for Maple Leaf School on McIvor as the school division is planning to build an addition to the school

The East Kildonan Community Committee recommends that a sanitary sewer to be built on McIvor between Rothesay and Henderson Highway and then to a point 670 feet south of McIvor at a cost of \$38,957 and a watermain along Pentland to McIvor between Pentland and Rothesay at a cost of \$24,936

The East Kildonan Parks Board recommends closing Kimberly between London and the East End of the Kimberly Recreational area

April 20, 1972 – Certificates of Merit are awarded to Miss Shannon Armstrong and Miss Mindy Ann Armstrong for their bravery for rescuing a young boy from the Red River on February 27, 1972

The Kildonan Country Fair is granted a Beer Garden License for their third annual fair

The East Kildonan Fire Fighters Association receives a grant of \$200 to aid in their holding of the 21th Professional Fire Fighter Association meeting at the Nor-Villa Motor Hotel

May 9, 1972 – Residents in the first block of Gilmore Avenue east of Henderson Highway complain about the heavy trucks using Gilmore to make deliveries to the new development under construction east of Pentland. The trucks are a danger to their children and the trucks are damaging the pavement

May 18, 1972 – The Community Committee recommends that traffic lights be installed at Henderson Highway and Edison and at Springfield Road and Henderson Highway.

The C.P.R. is asked to allow the construction of sidewalks on both sides of Munroe on the crossing of C.P.R. Mainline adjacent to Molson

A Beer Garden Permit is granted to the Gateway Recreational Center in conjunction with the North Kildonan Community Club and a Beer Garden Permit is granted to the East Kildonan Lions Club

The speed limit on Knowles Avenue east of Highway 59 is to be reduced from 45 miles per hour to 30 miles per hour

June 13, 1972 – There are complaints from residents of Larsen, Bowman and Jamison living east of Watt about Co-op Implements Plant employees parking on their streets. Two hour parking limits are to be placed on these streets until the Co-op plant moves out of the area in the near future

June 15, 1972 – The River East School Division receives a grant of \$400 for school patrol work.

There are complaints are the disposal of grain and other material that was placed on Stanley Copp's land east of Highway 59 from the burned out Maple Leaf Mills Plant on Archibald and about the car shredder plant on Springfield Road.

Automatic flashing lights are to be placed on McLeod at the C.P.R. Lac du Bonnet Line

June 19, 1972 – A report is presented on the feasibility of amalgamating all fire departments in the City of Winnipeg

A car allowance of \$75.00 per month is to be given to the East Kildonan Fire Department Chief and to the Deputy Fire Chief and \$40.00 per month to the Acting Deputy Fire Chief.

The north leg of the sanitary interception sewer along Rothesay from Douglas north to McIvor is to be completed early in 1973

July 11, 1972 – Sidewalks in Valley Gardens are proposed for both sides of Louelda, London, Antrim, Tu Pelo, Gateway and McLeod

A report is made on the feasibility of amalgamating all police departments in Winnipeg

July 27, 1972 – The Kildonan Country Fair receives a grant of \$2,000.

The Community Committee is requested to submits ideas to celebrate Winnipeg's Centennial in 1974

August 21, 1972 – Property is leased to John Petrasko for a 5 year period on the east side of Henderson Highway south of Douglas for a year round garden center

September 11, 1972 – Domo Gasoline Corporation Limited is given permission to establish a gas kiosk at the Northdale Shopping Centre at 951 Henderson Highway

Mr. L. E. Klump is appointed the Community Administration and Mrs. P. Egan is appointed the Community Clerk

September 14, 1972 – Over 300 residents attend a meeting where a zoning change is being considered for the west side of Henderson Highway north of Bredin Drive. The proposed zoning change would allow the construction of high rise apartment blocks.

September 19, 1972 – The River East School Division calls for traffic lights at Henderson Highway and Whellams Lane instead of the present pedestrian crosswalk

The East Kildonan Police Department continues to have five police cruisers to patrol the area the former City of East Kildonan had three police cars and the former Municipality of North Kildonan had two police cars.

September 28, 1972 – The East Kildonan Community Committee recommends that traffic lights be installed at Henderson Highway and Whellams Lane

October 10, 1972 – Emergency vehicles of the East Kildonan Fire Department are to no longer transfer the ill or injured to hospital as the Inner City Rescue Service are to take over the work.

October 26, 1972 – The official opening of the East Kildonan Recreational Centre (Terry Sawchuk Arena) is set for November 14, 1972

November 20, 1972 – The River East School Division announces that it plans to a 123 foot by 196 foot addition to Maple Leaf School.

Bus service on Henderson Highway is being extended north from Douglas to Glenway.

A further 1.5 acres of land is being purchased at a cost \$4,875 to the north of the East Kildonan Recreational Centre to enlarge the site.

December 4, 1972 – The East Kildonan Jaycees plan to raise \$50,000 for the purpose of making a grant towards the construction of a swimming pool in the area

The Community Committee endorses a City of Winnipeg Planning Report that the city acquire all property for a width of 60 feet on both sides of Bunn's Creek from the Red River to Highway 59

December 19 1972 – The Bunn's Creek Bridge at Uxbridge Road is to be retained as a pedestrian bridge

December 28, 1972 – The Community Committee informs the Executive Policy Committee that it opposed to having all of the functions of the Community Committee being taken over by the Central Council

Miss Margaret Kennedy is given a payment of \$150 and a balance of \$350 when she completes her history of East Kildonan

August 18, 1975 – A two storey addition 56 feet by 90 feet for the East Kildonan Baptist Church at 700 Watt Street is approved

August 25, 1975 – The Henderson Regional Library Board asks for an extra appropriation of \$68,000 to establish a branch library for the Elmwood area at 185 Stadacona Street

The Community Committee asks that the old North Kildonan Fire Hall Building on Essar Avenue be removed and the property be landscaped after the building is removed

The pedestrian corridor at Springfield Road and Rothesay is to be removed and made into a four way stop

The proposed East Kildonan Indoor Swimming Pool site is moved from Kimberly beside the indoor arena to a site on Concordia next to Kildonan East Regional Secondary School

Bruce Bodie is appointed to the Henderson Regional Library Board for the remainder of 1975

September 15, 1975 – Two 6 storey apartment blocks are to be built in the vicinity of Antrim Road and Reay Crescent

A shopping centre is proposed for the area lying between Molson and Lagimodiere between Crozier and Dunrobin with parking for 2,700 cars

September 22, 1975 – The parking lot at North Kildonan Community Club is paved at a cost of \$11,800

October 14, 1975 – The Greater Winnipeg Community Centres Board receive a grant of \$300 in support of their annual conference

Campus Life receives a grant of \$1,000

A grant of \$572 is given towards the recognition night for former East Kildonan Chief Constable Chris Einfeld at the Norvilla Hotel on November 14, 1975

November 3, 1975 – a three storey 42 suite apartment block is approved for the south side of Donwood Drive

November 12, 1975 There are an average of 255 people on welfare per month in the East Kildonan Community with about 45% of those living in the two Elmwood Wards. The welfare assistance budget is set at \$322,000 for the East Kildonan Community for 1975 about \$105 per month per person

A crosswalk is now in place on Henderson Highway in front of the Kelvin Community Centre

November 24, 1975 – Land is to be sold at the northeast corner of Springfield Road and Edelweiss Crescent to the Northdale Mennonite Fellowship Church. The site was originally set aside by the former Municipality of North Kildonan as a fire hall site but with the fire hall at McIvor and Rothesay opening in June 1975 the land has become surplus

December 22, 1975 – Mr. Wally Lewis of 360 Chelsea Avenue is suggested as the crossing guard at the Neil Avenue and Henderson Highway crosswalk for students attending Prince Edward School

A total of \$20,000 in provincial government lottery funds is to be spent on Valley Gardens projects

Appointed to the Henderson Regional Library for 2 year terms

The Elmwood Curling Club receives a grant of \$1,000

The East Kildonan Parks Department plans to vacate offices at 755 Henderson Highway and move to the soon to be vacated Police Department Quarters on Watt Street

January 14, 1976 – The Talbot Social Club receives a grant of \$1,953

January 15, 1976 – Traffic lights are to be installed at Almey and Lagimodiere

January 19, 1976 – The Group Home at 597 Henderson Highway is ordered to vacate the premises on March 31, 1976 after many complaints from local residents

January 26, 1976 – Appointed to the East Kildonan Parks Board for 1976

The city is requested to do everything in its power to move the Shangra-la Village Trailer Park and Toro's Driving Range as this property is in the area of the proposed regional park (Kilcona)

February 16, 1976 – A grant of \$235 is given to the Valley Garden Community School Association for their grand opening on February 19 and 21, 1976

February 23, 1976 – Dad's Pop Shoppe at 8-963 Henderson Highway is given permission to install four additional pinball machines

The Finance Committee is urged to approve spending \$211,886.23 for the Kent Road School and East Elmwood Community Centre Project

Community Service Awards are given to L, McMahon, John Klassen and E. Lee

Four Way Stop Signs are requested for Brazier and McLeod

March 1, 1976 – Land is rezoned to allow a funeral home to be built on the east side of Henderson Highway north of McIvor

March 22, 1976 – The East Kildonan Country Fair receives a grant of \$3,500

Traffic counts reveal 28,000 cars use Henderson Highway from 7 am to 7 pm weekdays at Carmen Avenue. At the morning peak hour between 7:15 am to 8:15 am, 2400 vehicles travel south and in the evening peak rush hour 2200 vehicles travel north and 1000 vehicles travel south

April 5, 1976 – The River East School Division is given permission to build a new gymnasium on the south side of John Henderson Junior High at 930 Brazier Street

A day nursery is approved for 122 Morningmead Walk

April 13, 1976 – Complaints are heard that both Bonner and McIvor are illegally being used as truck routes. Vehicles are speeding on both streets because there are no stop signs on either street from Henderson Highway to Lagimodiere Boulevard. Vehicles are parking on both sides of the street sometimes directly across from each other impeding traffic.

There are complaints from residents living in the 700 block of Fleming that teachers from Sherwood School are parking all day on the street

April 19, 1976 – The Hudson Bay Company proposes building a regional shopping centre on the east side of Lagimodiere in the area north of Grassie Boulevard and south of the Cordite Ditch

April 26, 1976 – Traffic lights are recommended from Kimberly and Gateway

Mrs. J. Coulter a senior citizen and early settler expresses a wish that certain artifacts in her possession be donated for display in a public building preferably a museum or something in that nature in the community. Mrs. Coulter and her husband were market gardeners and received many ribbons for the quality of their produce. She presents to the Community Committee a framed display of her ribbons.

May 3, 1976 – The East Kildonan Horticultural Society receives a grant of \$225

The Bronx Park Community Club receives a grant of \$352.50 for a boat trip for seniors on a paddlewheel boat

A proposal is made to convert the former St Clements School at 829 Watt Street into a medical office building but a total of 316 local residents sign a petition against the project and as a result the proposal is killed

Juniors Restaurants propose building a restaurant at 290 Henderson Highway at the southwest corner of Henderson Highway and Martin

June 21, 1976 – A grant of \$700 is given to the East Kildonan-Transcona Manitoba Games Group

A grant of \$166 is given to the St Alphonsus Council Catholic Women's League to transport 100 senior citizens to Selkirk Park on June 29, 1976.

A grant of \$250 to cover the cost of office supplies for two students working on projects for the East Kildonan Resident Advisory Group

A sanitary landfill site is to be created in the extreme northeast corner of the East Kildonan Community which eventually will be turned into a large regional park

June 28, 1976 – Mr. Frank de Graff of 982 McLeod Avenue is given permission to remain on his former property that he has lived on for 60 years until the park is ready to be developed. He is to rent his former property from the city for \$600 per year

July 5, 1976 – The River East School Division is given permission to install two temporary huts at Kildonan East Regional Secondary School for classroom space

July 12, 1976 – The Manitoba Summer Games East Kildonan/Transcona Committee receives a grant of \$600 for 200 jackets

July 26, 1976 – The Community Committee is informed that 27,000 vehicles pass Henderson Highway at Johnson in a 12 hour period from 7 am to 7 pm and at McIvor and Henderson Highway the count is 8,000 vehicles

Prosecution proceedings are begun against the Radio Oil Limited property at 451 Golspie for failure to maintain their property in a proper state of repair

There are complaints about speeding on Gilmore Avenue east of Pentland the problem is blamed about the lack of stop signs on Gilmore from Pentland to Raleigh August 23, 1976 – Manitoba Housing and Renewal Corporation is given permission to build five structures each with three or four semi-detached housing units on the east side of Rothesay between Paufeld and Donwood

Mr. Stanley Copp of 2074 De Vries Road is told to refrain from operating his business until he appears before the Community Committee

A portion of the boulevard on Munroe adjacent to the senior citizens block at Watt and Munroe is to be cut and paved for street parking

Four Way Stops are requested for the intersections of Gilmore and Rothesay and at Tu-Pelo and London

Traffic lights are requested for Johnson and Roch

The old North Kildonan Fire Hall formally on Essar has now been moved to Inkster and Route 59

September 7, 1976 – The Elmwood Cemetery at 132 Henderson Highway is given permission to construct four metal sheds 12 feet by 22 feet for the storage of cemetery equipment

The River East Minor Hockey Association receives a grant of \$3,000 for new uniforms

September 27, 1976 – The River East School Division urgently asks for a sidewalk to be built on McIvor from Henderson Highway to Raleigh for the benefit of students attending Maple Leaf School

October 18, 1976 – The St Alphonsus Credit Union is given permission to build a one storey building at 655 Henderson Highway at Sydney

November 1, 1976 – Several hours are spent at a meeting discussing a proposed regional shopping centre east of Lagimodiere north of Grassie to be built by the Hudson's Bay Company

A church building is approved for the northeast corner of Springfield Road and Edelweiss

November 8, 1976 – The River East Jaycees receive a transfer of \$1,315.94 from the East Kildonan Jaycees for the repair of and refurbishment of the East Kildonan Community float

St Gerard's Ladies Auxiliary receives a grant of \$350 for a senior citizens Christmas party

November 15, 1976 – Klassen Funeral Chapel is given permission to build a building at 1897 Henderson Highway November 22, 1976 – Residents of the 800 blocks of Simpson and Consol between Besant and Concordia complain about numerous incidents of vandalism in their area involving the wilful destruction of property

The City is to acquire the necessary property to provide a 63 foot right-of-way along McIvor from Henderson Highway to Raleigh in order to build a sidewalk

December 6, 1976 – A retail liquor store building is approved for the Northdale Shopping Centre

December 13, 1976 – The Elmwood Curling Club receives a grant of \$1,250 for its Junior Curlers

December 20, 1976 – The Elmwood-East Kildonan Senior Citizens group at Poplar and Brazier receive a grant of \$750 to purchase a used domestic stove and a used fridge and freezer

The Elmwood Handball Team Club is given \$300 for equipment and uniform start-up costs

Appointed to the Henderson Regional Library Board for two year terms

Mrs. M. Goodwin – 121 Frasers Grove

Mr. K. Hall – 417 Munroe

Mr. E.B. Bodie Chairman of the Henderson Regional Library Board is appointed to the Winnipeg Library Board

December 30, 1976 – The Rossmere Curling Club is given a grant of \$1,250 for its Junior Club

January 12, 1977 – An addition and renovation of the Kelvin Community Centre building is proposed for \$180,365

January 17, 1977 – An addition to the Wilson Auto Electric Limited building at 600 Golspie is approved

Four of the community clubs in the East Kildonan Community over spend their budget for 1976 with the two highest being Gateway Community Club by \$7,500 and the North Kildonan Community Club by \$4,509.39

February 14, 1977 – Appointed to the Manitoba Parks and Recreation Association, Mr. Ed Link, Mr. Roy Davis, Mrs. Gerry Krawzuk, Mr. Ray Brunka, Mr. David Bain, Mrs. Anne Jorowski, Mr. Joe Sandrk and Mr. Floyd Williston

The air support structure bubble is to go up over the tennis courts at the River East Recreation site to be go up on February 17, 1977

The Rosewell Community Centre is to become the office and storage area for the River East Minor Hockey Association

February 21, 1977 – A home occupation license is given to Mrs. Linda Wall of 190 Dearborn for homemade knitted articles

February 23, 1977 – The total budget for the Henderson Regional Library is \$249,830 for 1977

The total East Kildonan Parks and Recreation budget for the East Kildonan Community for 1977 is \$1,641,000

February 28, 1977 – A billiard and amusement parlor license is approved for 1119 Henderson High

March 14, 1977 – The Elmwood Giants Baseball Team receives a grant of \$4,000 to a set up a new team in the Manitoba Junior Baseball League

March 28, 1977 – A request is made for a 4 way stop at Rothesay and Gilmore. Traffic counts indicate 470 cars on Gilmore at Rothesay from 7 am to 9 am and 170 cars on Rothesay at Gilmore from 7 am to 9 am

April 12, 1977 – The lease to the East Kildonan Lions Club/Gateway Gun building is renewed for a further three years

April 14, 1977 – The Elmwood-East Kildonan Senior Centre on Poplar is given a grant of \$125 for its official opening on April 27, 1977 to provide for refreshments.

A grant of \$720 is authorized to send 12 local children to attend the "Y" Camp at St Stephens at \$60 per child for a one week period

Suggest names for the new indoor pool on Concordia include, Archie Taylor, East Kildonan Swimarena, Christian Einfeld or Chris Einfeld, EK Aqua Pool, Concordia Swim Area, Concord Pool or Concordia Pool, Curly Haas Memorial Pool and Pop Sidwell. It is decided to have a naming contest with the first prize being \$25 and \$15 for honourable mention

April 25, 1977 – The former North Kildonan Fire Hall site at Henderson Highway at Essar is to be cleaned up, have some fill added and to be planted with grass

May 5, 1977 – The East Elmwood Community Club is given a grant of \$500 to assist in the opening of the new facility

A grant of \$200 is to be given to Mr. and Mrs. E.R. Osborne for the repair of used dolls and toys for needy children for the Christmas Doll Program

May 9, 1977 – The Avaco Snowden Park is to be developed immediately, the cost of the 2.137 acres park is \$62,600

Russell Doern the Provincial Minister of Public Works suggests that the old Concordia Hospital site or in the case this site was too small the Elmwood Winter Club site be used as a rehabilitation fitness site instead of a site on Taylor Avenue

The new Elmwood Giants Baseball Team is to have its opening ceremonies on May 27, 1977. The original Elmwood Giants were formed in 1912

May 16, 1977 – Radio Oil Limited is given until May 31, 1977 to clean up their property located between Golspie, Munroe, Winterton and Raleigh or else legal action will be taken against the company

May 24, 1977 – Part of the Knowles School For Boys property west of Rothesay is to be rezoned for housing

A carnival license is approved for the Morse Place Community Club June 10-12, 1977

June 6, 1977 – The Gospel Missionary Union of Canada is given permission to establish a church office in an existing house at 2081 Henderson Highway

A grant of \$1,200 is given to the Mennonite Children's' Choir of Winnipeg to assistance in performances outside of Canada

A grant of \$300 is given to the Junior Boys Golf Program at Rossmere

A grant of \$250 is given to the Resident Advisory Group to purchase office supplies for summer students hired for recreational purposes

June 27, 1977 – Residents of the 500 block of Bowman complain about the many large trucks going to and from the Bowman Industrial Park and Inland Steel at 601 Bowman. The Community Committee recommends that Raleigh be extended south so trucks can Raleigh instead of Bowman

A grant of \$2,000 is given to the East Kildonan Country Fair at Gateway and Bonner

July 4, 1977 – St Stephens Anglican Church is given permission to construct an addition to the church at 220 Helmsdale Avenue

A grant of \$500 is given to cover the cost of refreshments for the official opening of the Elmwood Kildonan Pool at 909 Concordia Avenue

July 11, 1977 – The use of Anderson Park on Raleigh is given to the football teams of the area and taken away from the soccer teams on the grounds that money raised by the football teams built the building on the site and football was played on the site before soccer

July 13, 1977 – It is recommended that \$25,000 be spent to build four outdoor dressing rooms at Morse Place Community Club

The Elmwood-Kildonans swimming pool on Concordia is to open July 15, 1977

There are complaints about the vandalism occurring at Centennial Park behind Neil Campbell School

A new knock down rink is to be built at Melrose Community Club at a cost of \$8,000

July 18, 1977 – A special meeting is called to discuss the wide spread basement flooding that occurred on July 13, 1977

The North Kildonan Midget Major Soccer Team receives a grant of \$500 to cover travel expenses

July 25, 1977 – The name chosen for the indoor swimming pool on Concordia Elmwood-Kildonans Swimming Pool was suggested by Parks Board member Roy Davis but he refuses to take the \$25.00 prize

A beer garden permit is approved for the East Kildonan Country Fair for August 19-21, 1977

Four way stop signs are to be placed on Gateway Road at McIvor and on Gateway Road at Bonner

Residents of Cocks Boulevard ask that the spelling be changed to Cox Boulevard

August 8, 1977 – The total amount spent so far for the air structure support over the tennis courts beside the River East Arena is \$26,435 and another \$14,000 is needed to finish the project

Negotiations have begun with the C.P.R. in regards to the city acquiring the property of the Bergen Cut-off property

The wading pool at Tomlinson Park is now open

On the opening free day at the Elmwood-Kildonans Pool over 1500 took a free swim since then the average daily attendance has been 700 and 800

The North Kildonan Community Club receives a grant of \$660 for its soccer team that is cover expenses to represent Canada at the North American Soccer Championship

August 22, 1977 – The North Kildonan Bantam Baseball Team receives a grant of \$375 to host the Western Canadian Bantam Baseball Championships to be held at Gateway Community Club and Chalmers Community Club September 2-4, 1977

A sidewalk is requested for the east side of Henderson Highway between McIvor and Glenway

August 25, 1977 – A carnival license is approved for the Valley Gardens Community Club September 2-4, 1977

The Senior Citizens Centre at 180 Poplar is given \$10,877.28 to cover the cost of running the centre from September 1 to December 31, 1977

Castlewood Homes makes a proposal to turn over 1940 Henderson Highway to the city. Miss M. Kennedy, writer, Mr. Chuck Brooks, architect and Mark Guslitson have been hired by Castlewood Homes to work on a handbook depicting the history of the area. It is proposed that the old stone house and grounds could be used to depict an upper middle class family in the 1910-1915 era as a historical site and museum. There is an abundance of horticultural species on the site as well as an old arbor and stone carriage house. The main house still contains some of the original chandlers and other materials. The East Kildonan Community Committee approves in principle for the transfer of the property to the city.

September 6, 1977 – Twenty-five feet of the former North Kildonan Fire Hall site on Essar is sold to the property owner next to it

The residents of Donegal Bay complain that the area is plagued by vandalism

A community service award is given to Mrs. Olyhea Christiani for her volunteer work at the Elm-East Kildonan Senior Centre on Poplar

September 26, 1977 – Traffic lights are requested for Springfield Road and Lagimodiere as 400 trucks are expected to turn at this intersection to the landfill site on Springfield Road which will open shortly

The Elmwood-East Kildonan Senior Citizens group receives a grant of \$288 for the tour of the city and a boat trip on the Paddle Wheel Queen

The bubble top on the Four Seasons Tennis Club by the River East Arena is to be raised on October 17, 1977

October 31, 1977 – The last meeting for outgoing Councillors, Ray Brunka, Norm Stapon Mike Ruta and Alf Penner

The Bronx Park Soccer Club receives a grant of \$225
