Wet Weather Slows Work On New Kildonan School

A. R. McEwen; publicity chairman of the East Kildonan School Board, stated this week that contrary to rumors currently circulating in the municipality, the new Angus McKay School, Dunrobin and Woodlawn, will be completed this year but not in time for the September school opening.

Mr. McEwen said that it was quite evident, unfortunately, that the new school will not be finished until several weeks after Sept. Ist with the result that some pupils in the area will have staggered classes this fall.

Peter Koop, contractor, stated that the delay in the construction of the school was due to the unusually high level of the river this spring.

Earlier this summer, when work was first started on the building, Mr. Koop experienced trouble in sinking piers. At 12 feet water was discovered in a layer of sandy soil. The water came in so fast that a shaft could not be sunk.

Work was halted mementarily, and with the unusually rainy weather this summer, the workmen were not able to get back to the lob mail this week.

Thirty-six eight foot piers have since been sunk with a cone-shaped bottom that has a spread of 56 inches. There will be a total of 72 such piers and Mr. Koop stated they will be just as sound as the originally planned piers, which would have been considerably deeper but without the "spread board" or "bell" bottom.

The other new elementary school, the Munroe School on Munroe ave., is rapidly nearing completion and will be ready for school opening in September. Fortunately no below ground level problems were encountered.

Angus McKay to get gym after all

A delegation of trustees from the River East school board met last Wednesday morning with officials of the Public Schools Finance Board and convinced the board to change its mind and allocate funds for a gymnasium at Angus McKay and for work on Robert Andrews school.

A delegation of trustees Allen Rouse and Bryon Peterson, superintendant Dr. D.A. Downie and secretary-treasurer of the division Nick Solilak appealed an earlier decision by the provincially-appointed board which denied the school board the funds it required to undertake construction at the two schools.

Residents who lived near the Angus McKay school were told earlier this year that the gym would be built and ready to use this term hut because funds were refused the construction hasn't yet begun.

Unless school boards obtain required funds for construction from the province's Public Schools Finance Board, they must dip into special levy funds for money. These funds are obtained through increasing property taxes.

River East division has had to appeal several PSFB decisions on funding in the past year especially. Some trustees wondered aloud if the granting of the appeal wasn't really an about face in PSFB policy, however Allen Rouse, who headed the delegation as then-chairman of the board, warned trustees not to be misled

"I think it was our presentation that did it," he said, and other members of the delegation agreed.
