

# DIAMOND JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS TUESDAY

In discussing the celebration of the sixtieth anniversary of the entrance of the province into confederation, Hon. John Bracken, premier of Manitoba, expressed the opinion that the parish of Kildonan, which he very fittingly described as "the cradle of the province of Manitoba," should take a leading part in commemorating that event. Following up the premier's suggestion, Reeve D. J. Allan called a representative meeting of the municipality, at which committees were struck to consider and arrange plans for a suitable celebration of the diamond jubilee. These committees, under the general chairmanship of the reeve, now announce the following programme:

1. **Monster Street Parade.**—Parade consisting of floats representing national, local, and industrial development, decorated automobiles and bicycles, local organizations, etc., will form up on Watt street and Munroe avenue, opposite Polson school at 1.00 p.m. Route of parade, Munroe avenue and Henderson Highway to Bronx Park, where monster community picnic and celebration will be held.

2. **Raising the Flag.**—Chorus, "O, Canada," by pupils of the local schools. Short addresses by the chairmen of the celebration committee, and two well known old time residents.

3. **Platform Attractions.**—Contributed by local National and Social organizations, featuring Maypole Dance, Highland Dancing, Ukrainian Choir in National folk songs, Minstrel troupes, etc.

4. **Sports.**—Races for children of school age, games, etc. Exhibition games of baseball, British rugby, etc.

5. **Dancing on the green.**

The committee extends an invitation to residents owning cars to join in the parade, and announce that prizes will be awarded for the best decorated bicycles ridden by boys and girls. They also report that arrangements have been made for supplying refreshments on the picnic grounds at moderate cost.
