

EAST KILDONAN BUILDING THREE FINE NEW SCHOOLS

The corner-stone of the new Lord Wolseley school in East Kildonan will be laid Saturday afternoon, at 2.30. The ceremony will be performed by Major-General Steele, and it is peculiarly appropriate that he should act, in view of the fact that he was closely identified with Lord Wolseley in western Canada. The cadet corps of the East Kildonan schools will form a guard of honor for General Steele.

The municipality of East Kildonan is at present building three new schools, at a total cost of \$180,000. Work on them all is going on at the present time. The schools are the Salisbury, the Lord Wolseley and the Lord Kitchener. The corner-stone of the Salisbury school was laid last Saturday afternoon by Mrs. James McWee, wife of one of the trustees, and an address was given by D. A. Ross, M.P.P. This school is located at Morse place.

The Lord Wolseley school is on the East Kildonan road in the central part of the municipality, and the Lord Kitchener school is on the same road, farther north. The corner-stone of the latter will be laid some time in May.

Gifts to Schools.

At the laying of the corner-stone of the new Salisbury school last Saturday it was announced that D. A. Ross, M.P.P. for St. Clements, had presented two manual training benches for each school in East Kildonan, and the provincial government will supplement this gift with two more for each school. It was also announced that the Neil Campbell fund of \$500 would be given to provide three yearly prizes for the Salisbury school.

The Salisbury school will relieve the great pressure on the Polson school, East Kildonan, which cannot
