EAST KILDONAN PIONEER IS DEAD

Mrs. Donald McIvor Spent Her Whole Life in Parish—Husband Died Last Year.

One of the oldest and best known resident of Kildonan; in the person of Mrs. Marion McIvor, passed away early this morning at her home in East Kildonan. Mr. McIvor was born at Kildonan, June 10, 1836; her father, George Munroe, a native of Inverness, Scotland, and her mother, whose maiden name was Annie Matheson, of Kildonan, Scotland, having been among the settlers brought to Kildonan by Lord Selkirk. Mrs. McIvor had spent the whole of her life in the parish of Kildonan, and there was no person better known or more popular within its bounds. Her husband, David McIvor, an old Hudson's Bay factor, died last May.

Mrs. McIvor is survived by five sons, three daughters, 21 grand children, and seven great-grandchildren. Her sons are: Dr. N. K. McIvor, of this city; Angus, of Kildonan, Man.; D. W., of the Dominion government immigration department; A. J., of the Winnipeg public park board, and Robert; her daughters, Mrs. Ross, wife of Donald A. Ross, M.P.P., for St. Clements; Mrs. Samuel Taylor, College avenue, Winnipeg; and Miss Annie, living at the old home. Mrs. McIvor, during the whole of her lifetime, had taken a prominent interest and part in the work of the Presbyterian church, of her locality.

Arrangements are being made for the funeral to be held from her late residence at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon. The interment will be made at Kildonan cemetery, and the services will be in the hands of Rev. Hugh Hamilton and Rev. Samuel Polson.
