Bronx Park Community Centre held a ribbon cutting ceremony Saturday, April 27 signifying the beginning of major reconstruction projects at the site.

Among the projects are:

- construction of a detached storage building for maintenance equipment
- construction of a new baseball back-stop on the north west corner of the property
- asphaltting of the current gravel parking lot
- construction of two hockey rinks complete with players' boxes with new light fixtures.

The projects are expected to be completed by the end of June.

**RE-VITALIZE**

Funding is coming from the three levels of government. The City of Winnipeg grant is a component of the capital budget; while the provincial portion comes from the Manitoba Jobs Fund — Manitoba Community Assets Program and the federal grant is designated from the Employment Development Branch Canada Works Section 38 Program.

On hand for the ribbon cutting were MP for Winnipeg-Bird's Hill, Bill Blaikie; MLA for Rossmere, Vic Schroeder, city councillor for the Miles Macdonell Ward Anne Jorowski and community centre president John Wawszko.

Each was in receipt of an engraved pair of sissors from the executive and board of directors of the community centre to commemorate the ceremony.

During an interview following the ceremony, centre president Wawszko noted, "At this point, the community club would like to thank the staff of the East Kildonan-Transcona parks and recreation branch under their manager Dick Todd, with special thanks also to Branden Fast. In the provincial government, we would like to thank the department of employment services and economic security under Len Evans, director Dave McCulloch and give special thanks to assistant director Wayne

Blackburn and his staff.

Continuing Wawszko added, "We would also like to thank the federal government employment development branch project officer Sheila Ross and the Canada Employment Centre Winnipeg East office which includes Frances Shastky and Fran Burnell."

# Open Drive For New Building

The meeting of canvassers for the East Kildonan Community club's building fund drive takes place tonight and final plans will be cleared for the \$25,000 campaign.

The plans for the coming season are extensive, and it is in the interest of all citizens of East Kildonan to assist in every way possible. The following are on the educational and recreational program:

Model aircraft building, woodworking, shop work, boxing, wrestling, tumbling, weight lifting, basketball, volleyball, football, baseball, hockey, speed skating, fancy skating, badminton, first aid, home nursing, painting, clay modeling, carving, leather craft, dress-making, dramatics and public speaking.

A supervised children's playground will be operated all summer and the services of a full-time recreational instructor is planned to organize all phases of outdoor recreation.

The new hall plans call for the following:

Size: 60 feet wide, 120 feet long, full basement with 60-ft. square lounge, canteen, kitchen, rest rooms, woodworking shop and furnace room.

Main floor: Entrance hall 15 feet by 60 feet, with two cloak rooms, office and basement entrance. Main auditorium, 60 feet wide by 90 feet long, stage 15 feet deep by 30 feet wide and two 15-ft. square dressing rooms, one on each side of the stage. The auditorium will be large enough for a regulation-sized basketball floor and two badminton courts.

# New \$30,000 Clubhouse Planned For Bronx Park

With the co-operation of the Parks Board of East Kildonan, and a \$15,000 bank loan, construction on a new clubhouse will begin within a week or ten days. By the end of October,

a dream will finally have been fulfilled.

The \$30,000 building promises four dressing rooms 14x10, a spacious kitchen and canteen area, and large skating rinks. The clubrooms will be twice as big as the old ones, allowing a more complete sports program including volleyball and badminton.

Besides providing new benefits for all, the success of this long hoped-for project is living proof of what can be accomplished when a community works together for a common purpose, and when a few tenacious men and women refuse to take "no" for an answer.

The new clubhouse will be open to everybody in this area. You who live here, and have contributed in any small way to its birth, own it.

# New Community Club Planned In Kildonan

An intensive drive for funds for a new and more commodious Community club for East Kildonan will be launched today by a force of some 80 canvassers. President Jack E. Willis, 174 Helmsdale ave., called at *The Herald* office Monday, and advised of the latest plans for the campaign. The objective is set at \$5,000. Other officers of the recently-re-organized club follow:

Past president—W. S. Douglas, 163 Hazeldell ave., is in charge of the membership drive.

First vice-president—L. C. Kal-koven, 280 Munroe ave.

Second vice-president—Mrs. H. H. Matthews, 248 Ottawa ave.

Secretary—R. H. Skinner, 150 Linden ave.

Treasurer—F. R. Dill, 164 Hazeldell ave.

Executive—Mrs. P. D. Paul, 442 Henderson Highway; L. A. McMahon, 223 Neil ave., and V. M. Snow, 221 Donalda ave.

The new site, made available to the club by the East Kildonan council, is the Bronx Park area extending from Henderson Highway to Kildonan Drive along the Red River between Bronx and Chelsea avenues.

Plans for the new community club call for a new clubhouse, a baseball and football field complete with bleachers, a hockey rink to be used for box lacrosse in summer, a skating circle to be used as a running track in summer, a fancy skating sheet, volleyball and basketball courts, tennis courts and a wading pool.

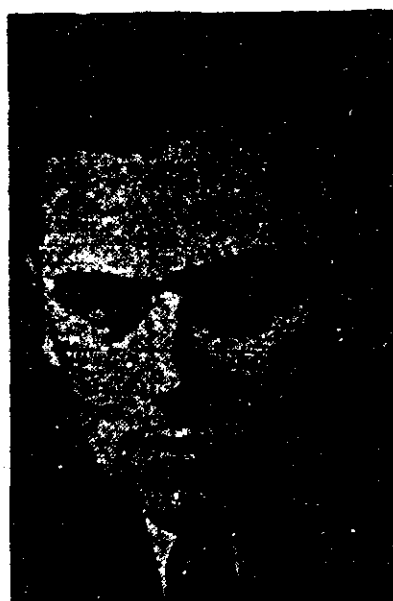
Either the old clubhouse with additions or a new clubhouse will be set up near the front of the park along Henderson Highway. It will have an auditorium suitable for dancing, basketball, volleyball and badminton, a large stage, dressing rooms, canteen and lounge.

The hall and its facilities are to be available afternoons and evenings for community groups.

A boost in membership from 600 to 1,200 at \$1 per family as well as donations will be sought during the campaign which carries until April 30th.

Mr. Willis stressed the idea that at least the East Kildonan Community club would be working on a permanent site, and that the club would strive to serve all the recreational needs of the community.
