# JOHN HENDERSON, PIONEER, DIES

## Former President of Selkirk Conservative Association Passes Away

The death of John Henderson, 606 East Kildonan road, Sunday afternoon, has removed a pioneer who gave much to the development of the Red River district.

Mr. Henderson was born in the parish of St. Paul, Nov. 14, 1841, and attended St. Paul and Kildonan schools. While quite young, Mr. Henderson took up farming as his life's work. In politics, he was a Conservative, having been at one time president of the Selkirk County Conservative association. For 25 years he was a member of the municipal council and for 20 years a member of the school board. He was a life member and past vice-president of the Lord Selkirk association of Rupert's Land.

The funeral will take place at 2.30 o'clock Tuesday, and will proceed from the home to Kildonan cemetery.
