

Change In School Boundaries Made

A temporary change in the boundaries of the various schools in the East Kildonan school district, made necessary by the large number of new homes in the municipality, and the expected influx of new pupils, has been announced by the secretary of the district.

The new boundary lines are as follows: For Prince Edward school: Montrose avenue to Helmsdale; on the west from Red River across Henderson Highway to Brazier, on the east from Montrose avenue north to lane between Bowman and Jamieson, east to Roche, north to Trent avenue, east to Watt street, and north on Watt to Helmsdale.

For Polson school: East and south of above described Prince Edward school district and east to C.P.R. main line tracks.

For Salisbury school: All area east of C.P.R. main line tracks within the municipality of East Kildonan.

For Lord Wolseley school: Area north of Helmsdale to municipal limits, on north, from Red River on west to C.P.R. tracks on the east.

The grades to be taught in the various schools are: in Prince Edward school, grades one to nine; Polson school, grades one to eight; Salisbury school, grades one to eight; Lord Wolseley, grades one to five.

Arrangements have been made for all collegiate students in the municipality to register at the Lord Wolseley school. This year, the East Kildonan school board announces, grades XII will be again taught in the collegiate and high school. Students living outside the municipality, who wish to enroll in the collegiate, will be registered by J. Colvin, the secretary-treasurer, September 3.

E.K. Board Outlines School Boundaries

In common with most growing districts in Greater Winnipeg, East Kildonan School District No. 14 is finding it difficult to fit all its school children into the buildings nearest their homes.

The younger pupils have been placed in the schools nearest home, but some older elementary and some junior high pupils will have greater distances to travel. This is, of course, a temporary measure effective only until the building program of the School District is completed.

At present the School Board has definite plans under discussion, which they hope to place before the electorate this fall, for the adequate and convenient accommodation of every child in the city.

In a growing district it is impossible to forecast the enrolment accurately, and the Board asks for the understanding and co-operation of all parents.

After registration on Tuesday it will be necessary to make minor adjustments in some boundaries to meet the needs of the children

ELEMENTARY GRADES

West of Henderson Highway

1. Prince Edward School serves the district from Chelsea south to Elmwood Park in grades 1 to 6, and also takes grades 5 and 6 as far north as Helmsdale.

2. Angus McKay takes pupils in grades 1 to 4 in the area north of Bronx, and the grade 5's between Bronx and Roberta.

3. Grade 6 pupils living north of Dunrobin go to Lord Wolseley School, as do the grade 5's living north of Leighton

East of Henderson Highway

All pupils living on McLeod, and on the south side of Oakland, go to the new McLeod School for grades 1 to 6.

Lord Wolseley School serves the area from Colvin to Dunrobin, except that east of Roch street, pupils living between Linden and Melrose go to Neil Campbell School. With the exception of this Neil Campbell area Prince Edward district stretches from Helmsdale to Trent, east of Henderson Highway

Polson School serves the district south of Trent avenue, taking grades 1 to 6 east of Roch street, and grades 4 to 6 between Roch and Henderson Highway. Munroe Elementary School serves grades 1 to 3 between Roch and Henderson Highway.

In the area east of the CPR tracks, all grade 6's will be accommodated

Elmwood Schools Open Tuesday; 3,900 Registered

Another Elmwood High teacher, Miss Ruth Skinner, physical education instructor, was chosen to represent the Winnipeg schools at the Physical Education convention now being held in Toronto.

East of Henderson Highway

All pupils living on McLeod, and on the south side of Oakland, go to the new McLeod School for grades 1 to 6.

Lord Wolseley School serves the area from Colvin to Dunrobin, except that east of Roch street, pupils living between Linden and Melrose go to Neil Campbell School. With the exception of this Neil Campbell area Prince Edward district stretches from Helmsdale to Trent, east of Henderson Highway.

Polson School serves the district south of Trent avenue, taking grades 1 to 6 east of Roch street, and grades 4 to 6 between Roch and Henderson Highway. Munroe Elementary School serves grades 1 to 3 between Roch and Henderson Highway.

In the area east of the CPR tracks, all grade 6's will be accommodated in the new Morse Place Junior High building, as will the grade 3's from the Salisbury area. Otherwise Salisbury School serves the area from Moncton north, and Sherwood from Munroe south.

JUNIOR HIGH GRADES

Morse Place Junior High School will house all grade 7 to 9 pupils east of the CPR.

Munroe Junior High will serve the area from Chelsea avenue south and Melrose the district from Bronx avenue north, except that for this year grade 7 pupils living from Hazeldell north, will be asked to go to Neil Campbell School.

This move is necessary because East Kildonan School District has to rent rooms in Melrose School to the River East Division to accommodate grade 12 students living in the City of East Kildonan.

E.K. School Boundaries Set 1961

East Kildonan schools will open Tuesday morning at 9 o'clock. Pupils who were not enrolled last June should take along their last report card as proof of their grade.

Each school has been assigned a district for the purpose of registering pupils. It is difficult to forecast enrolment at any school, and adjustments will be necessary after registration on Tuesday.

Following are the school boundaries:

ELEMENTARY GRADES

West of Henderson Highway

1. Angus McKay School will serve all pupils living north of Bronx Park.

2. Prince Edward School will serve those living south of Bronx Park.

East of Henderson Highway

1. Pupils on McLeod avenue and the south side of Oakland avenue go to McLeod School.

2. Pupils living between Maxwell Place and Helmsdale avenue as far east as Roch go to Lord Wolseley School, as do those living on Leighton or Roberta between Roch and Watt.

3. From Green to Melrose, all children living east of Roch street attend Neil Campbell School. This school also serves children east of Watt street on Bronx avenue.

Chelsea avenue and Roberta avenue
4. Prince Edward School serves the district west of Roch street from Melrose to Donalds. Between Roch and Watt it serves those from Chelsea to Trent.

5. Polson School serves pupils between Munroe and Montrose east of Brazier street, and pupils from Melbourne, Sydney, and Neil east of Watt.

6. Pupils living between Henderson Highway and Brazier street, south of Donalds, should register at Prince Edward School, though some may be asked to attend Polson School if Prince Edward is crowded.

East of Gateway Road

Grades 1 to 4

1. Salisbury School will take pupils living on Prince Rupert ave. and north of Prince Rupert.

2. Sherwood School will take pupils between Gateway Road and London street on Government ave. and all avenues south of Government.

3. Hampstead School will take all pupils living east of London street as far north as Government avenue.

Grades 5 and 6

1. Until the addition to Salisbury School is completed, all grade 6 pupils in this area will be housed in Hampstead School.

2. Grade 5 pupils living on Simpson, Consol and Fleming, west of Besant, and those living on Prince Rupert between Gateway and Grey, can probably be accommodated in Morse Place Junior High School. All other grade 5's will be in Hampstead School. As soon as the new addition is finished, pupils living in the district normally served by Salisbury School will return to Salisbury.

JUNIOR HIGH GRADES

Morse Place Junior High School will serve the district east of Gateway Road. Grade 8 and 9 pupils living on Helmsdale ave., or north of Helmsdale, will attend Melrose School. Those living on Melrose avenue or south of Melrose will attend Munroe School.

Until the addition is completed, Munroe School will accommodate only those grade 7's who live on Neil avenue, or south of Neil. Grade 7 pupils from Sydney avenue north will register at Melrose School.

When the Munroe School addition is ready, some grade 7 classes will be moved there to relieve the crowding at Melrose. These classes are being arranged to make the move with as little change in teachers and time tables as possible.

E.K. School Boundaries Listed For Registration

When East Kildonan elementary and junior high schools open on Tuesday morning nearly every available desk will be needed.

Each school has been assigned a district for the purpose of registering pupils on Tuesday, but some adjustment of boundaries will be necessary after registration.

Where changes have to be made, they will be completed within a day or two of school opening.

ELEMENTARY GRADES

West of Henderson Highway

1. Angus McKay school will register all pupils living north of Bronx Park.

2. Prince Edward school will register those living south of Bronx Park.

East of Henderson Highway

1. Between Henderson Highway and Roch Street, pupils on McLeod Avenue and the south side of Oakland register at Lord Wolseley school for grades one and two, and at McLeod school for grades three to six. East of Roch, all grades from these streets register at McLeod school.

2. Between Henderson Highway and Roch Street, from Maxwell Place or Pleasant Bay as far south as Helmsdale, pupils will register at Lord Wolseley school, as will those on Leighton between Roch and Watt.

3. East of Roch Street, all pupils living between Roberta and Kimberly register at Neil Campbell school. This school also serves children east of Watt Street on Bronx Ave.

4. Prince Edward school will register pupils living between Henderson Highway and Roch Street from Kimberly Avenue to Donalda Avenue, and those living between Roch and Watt from Chelsea to Trent, as well as children living in the first block east of the Highway from Munroe to Larsen.

5. Polson school will register pupils living east of Brazier from Larsen to Munroe, and pupils living on Chelsea, Melbourne, Sydney and Neil east of Watt Street.

East of Gateway Road

1. Hampstead school will register all pupils living east of London Street as far north as Government.

2. Pupils in grades one to four living west of London on Moncton Avenue and all avenues to the south will register at Sherwood school. Grade five and six pupils in this area will register at Hampstead school.

3. Salisbury school will register pupils living on Prince Rupert and to the north; and those on Government west of London.

JUNIOR HIGH GRADES

1. Morse Place Junior High will register all pupils living east of Gateway Road.

2. John Henderson Junior High will register pupils from Dunrobin and all avenues to the north.

3. Munroe Junior High will register pupils living on Helmsdale and all avenues to the south.

Grades 1 to 6

On Tuesday at 9 a.m., pupils in the elementary grades may register at the school they attended last year, except for those from last year's grade 4 classes at Sherwood School. They will register for grade 5 at Hampstead School.

Beginners will register at the nearest elementary school.

Grades 7 to 9

1. Morse Place Junior High will register all pupils living east of Gateway Road.

2. John Henderson Junior High will register pupils from Dunrobin and all avenues to the north.

3. Munroe Junior High will register pupils living on Helmsdale and all avenues to the south.

On the basis of last year's enrolment, plus the registration of beginners, East Kildonan schools should be able to open Tuesday morning without staggered classes.

Each school has been assigned a district for the purpose of registering pupils. However, it is difficult to forecast enrolment exactly, and some minor adjustments may be necessary after registration on Tuesday. The Board asks for the understanding and co-operation of all parents.

Following are the boundaries:

ELEMENTARY GRADES

West of Henderson Highway

Angus McKay School will serve all pupils north of Bronx Park.

Prince Edward School will serve those living south of Bronx Park.

East of Henderson Highway

Pupils on McLeod avenue and the south side of Oakland go to McLeod School.

Pupils living between Colvin Place and Dunrobin avenue as far east as Roch go to Lord Wolseley School, as do those living on Leighton or Roberta between Roch and Watt.

From Greene to Melrose, all children living east of Roche street attend Neil Campbell School. This school also serves children east of Watt street on Chelsea avenue and Roberta avenue.

Prince Edward School serves the district west of Roche street from Helmsdale to Donalds avenue. Between Roche and Watt it serves those from Bronx avenue to Trent

avenue.

Polson School serves pupils between Munroe and Montrose avenue east of Henderson Highway, and pupils on Melbourne, Sydney and Neil avenues east of Watt street.

East of Gateway Road Grades One to Four

Hampstead School will take all pupils living east of London street as far north as Government avenue.

Sherwood School will take pupils between Gateway Road and London street on Government avenue and all avenues to the south.

Salisbury School will take pupils living on Prince Rupert avenue and all to the north.

Grades Five and Six

Hampstead School will serve all pupils from Munroe avenue south to the city limits.

From Moncton ave. north, grade 5 pupils will go to Salisbury School and grades 6's will be accommodated in Morse Place Junior High School.

JUNIOR HIGH GRADES

Morse Place Junior High School will serve the district east of Gateway Road.

Lord Wolseley School will receive grade 7 pupils living on Roberta avenue or north of Roberta.

Melrose Junior High School will serve grade 7 pupils from Greene to Chelsea, and all grade 8 and 9 pupils living north of Chelsea ave.

Munroe Junior High School will serve all pupils living south of Chelsea avenue.
