New Building Planned

North Kildonan Divides School District Into Two

Because of a general growth in population, necessitating a continued increase in school facilities, it has been decided to divide the North Kildonan school district into two separate bodies. The change-over, approved by the North Kildonan council, will become effective July 10.

The new district will take in wards three and four, which is the rural section of the municipality. There are already two schools in this area, and it is planned to erect a third school in the near future.

This will be a fully modern, two-room structure. It will have its own well, with water pumped to the buildings, and a septic tank. A community hall is also to be constructed.

The schools have really been separated for years, and having a new school district authorized will save residents of wards three and

four from paying for the upkeep of the large school in the area which includes wards one and two.

At present, there are four school trustees, one from each ward. Under the change-over, it will be necessary for each of the separate districts to have three trustees. Accordingly, a meeting of electors of wards one and two will be held in the Lord Kitchener school at 8 p.m. Wednesday, when an additional trustee for that district will be elected.

The new school district will elect its extra trustee at a meeting to be held sometime after the change-over takes effect Monday.
