16" Watermain To Improve Water Supply In E. Kildonan

Greater Winnipeg's metropolitan government has called "tenders for the construction of a 16" watermain in East Kildonan this summer as part of its 1961 crash program to improve the supply of water to suburbantareas.

total length will be 8,300 feet, as compared with the MacLaren recommendation for a main of 2.150 feet. The feeder main will extend along the centre boulevard Henderson Highway

Construction is expected to start June 15th and to be completed around August 15th. Before construction can begin, however, Coun-I cillor Willis said it will be necessary to remove the hydro poles from

the centre boulevard. Councillor Willis said the estimated cost of the project is in the

neighborhood of \$176,000 The Henderson feeder main will be linked, temporarily, to the East Raths. Lutheran Church
