The most valuable of the trinkets worn by the women was a diamond ring valued at \$60, but a number of watches and other jewelers were also secured. The amount of moner secured could not well be settled by the victims among themselves, but as near as could be ascertained the robbers secured at least \$150 in cash, the male inmates having most of the "ready" in their possession.
