of the said City, will be strictly enforced. Household-ers, property-holders, and all others whom it may concern, will govern themselves accordingly.

The following extracts from the said By-law are condensed in substance, and submitted herewith for the information of all concerned:

"No person shall fraudulently adulterate, for the purpose of sale, bread, or other articles intended for food, with any substance injurious to the public health.

"No person shall sell, or offer for sale any tainted meat, fruit, vegetables, or any tainted article of food whatsoever; nor is any damaged article to be brought into the city.

"No person to maliciously defile or make impure any tank, well, spring, reservoir, or other source of water, and not to offer impure water for sale, taken from any water-hole or ice-hole which has become foul and unclean.

"Not to allow stagnant or putrid water in any lot, cellar, or excavation; and if such exist, the proprietor, occupant, tenant, or agent of the owner is liable to penalties if not remedied or removed.

"Not to deposit in any part of the city dead carcasses or other offensive matter, the owner of such dead animals is liable for their removal, and failing, the person on whose property such is deposited is also liable for the removal.

"No filth to be left on the streets, fallen from carts or wagons carrying dirt away, the owner of the said vehicle is liable.

"If any person shall own, occupy, and keep any lot of ground or other premises in such bad and filthy condition as to be offensive and a nuisance to the neighborhood, or to any person or family, such person shall be subject to the penalties provided for an infraction of this By-law, and to the like penalties for every day such nuisances shall continue, after notice to abate the same has been given to said owner or occupant.

"Every occupant of a house shall keep the yard or premises therewith connected in a clean state, and shall collect in one place in such yard or premises dirt, offal, kitchen water, or other accumulation of offensive substances, until there is sufficient for one load, when it must be removed at the expense of such occupant.

"Every lot having a dwelling-house erected thereon must have a privy connected with it, which must be kept in a clean state, and disinfectants used when privies are being cleansed and night soil removed, which must only be in the night-time.

"The owner or occupant of any house or lot must not discharge stinking or dirty water into the streets.

"Slaughter-houses not allowed inside the City without permission of the Mayor and Council, and must be limed and whitewashed once every month, and butchers' shops must be kept perfectly clean."

The penalty for an infringement of any of the clauses of said By-law is a fine of not more than twenty dollars, or in default, imprisonment in the common jail for a period not exceeding twenty-one days.
